What's happening

We are so thankful that we have kept open throughout the last 3 months and been able to feed everyone in need who came to us.

- The number of parcels we gave out in April-June was more than double over the same period last year
- We have been overwhelmed with the generosity of people and businesses. The largest source of donations was a few bags left at the door by so many people—almost 5 tonnes of food. Tesco and ASDA have continue to support us and Morrisons in Hyde have started to donate. Hope Community Church have kindly lent us storage space.
- We have set-up a Helpline staffed by volunteers at Onward Homes so clients can be referred to the foodbank when so many of usual referrers are working from home.
- We have opened a new distribution centre in Hyde at the Grafton Centre. The previous foodbank had to close at the start of the epidemic because many volunteers had to self isolate. Local councillors asked us to open a



replacement and we have been welcomed at the Grafton Center just off Clarke Way. We have now given out over 1,000 meals. Diversity Matters NW have been very helpful making links within the Bangladeshi community. We have a bilingual volunteer at the Grafton Centre and our Helpline has a bangla speaker on Tuesdays 10-3pm.

• We have started to do deliveries for clients who are self-isolating and do not have family or friends who can pickup. British Gas provided 2 volunteers a week to enable us to provide this service

Foodbank numbers

Please consider how you can help meet the growing need from local families in crisis

In April-July this year: Given out 509 food parcels

- Provided 13,437 meals.
- 44% of the people we fed were children

Average cost to buy food for a single parcel £30

Volunteers

Many of our regular volunteers have had to self isolate, but people on furlough have volunteered including from British Gas, HomeStart and White Label Recruitment. The Hattersley Air Cadet Squadron have helped out in the warehouse throughout the crisis—they work really hard and are a joy to be with. We are now at the stage where furloughed staff are returning to work and one or two of our regulars are coming back to foodbank and we have new volunteers at Hyde.
